REPORT OBJECTIVES

Pursuant to Section 25 (11) (b) of the Development Act, 1993 Council is holding a Public Hearing to allow respondents who have registered an interest to attend and be heard in relation to the DPA, an opportunity to provide verbal representation to the Committee.

BACKGROUND

Council has been undertaking a Development Plan Amendment (DPA), which proposes changes to housing density/diversity throughout a large proportion of the Residential Zone. The DPA also investigated the introduction of mixed-use, higher density development in appropriate locations. In particular, the DPA seeks the following:

- Greater density/diversity and mixed use development near transit corridors and activity centres
- Greater housing diversity in the south
- Mixed use development in local and neighbourhood centres
- New character areas in Glandore, Edwardstown, South Plympton & Plympton Park
- Lower density in the northern part of the Council to address issues with infill development

The voice of the community is an important component of the DPA process. To help inform Council's decision-making, the DPA was placed on public consultation for a period of 8 weeks. The consultation period started on 19 September 2017 and closed on 14 November 2017.

Consultation with the community was undertaken using various forms of media, including a letterbox drop to residents together with advertisements in the local newspaper and information on Council's website. Copies of the draft DPA were made available for viewing at the Council Offices and libraries, and on the City of Marion website. Three Community Information sessions were held, and in response to a request, a presentation was provided to the Marino Residents Association.

During the public consultation period, 287 submissions were received from the public, 2 from adjoining Councils and 8 from State Agencies. Over sixty respondents have requested to be heard at the public hearing.

Copies of all submissions have been made available for inspection by interested parties at the Council Administration Building following the closure of consultation period until the closure of the public hearing.

PUBLIC HEARING

It is recommended that formal meeting procedures be suspended to allow the Housing Diversity DPA Public Hearing to be undertaken and the opportunity for respondents to provide verbal submissions.

Respondents who have previously advised that they wish to provide a verbal submission will be heard in the first instance.

An opportunity for other persons to make a verbal submission may be provided at the end of the Hearing.

It is important to note that the Public Hearing is not an opportunity for public debate, nor is it a decision-making forum. The Public Hearing is an opportunity for persons to provide further verbal submissions to the Committee about the proposed amendments to the Development Plan. A record of all verbal submissions will be taken, and the matters raised will be provided to Council for consideration when undertaking the next draft of the DPA.
