Writes to the Minister of Planning to confirm the intention not to proceed with Part 2 of the Housing Diversity DPA or other policy changes (other than the Seacliff Park DPA), and also of Council's intention to pursue the best outcomes for our community as part of the Code implementation process.

#### Dear Mayor Hanna

I am a thirteen-year-old girl from Hallett Cove and it brings me great sorrow to learn that I, as part of the Cove Football Club, have been 'kicked out' of the Cove Community complex.

This year I started playing football for the first time in the Cove Under 14 girls team. As a female player I couldn't have asked for a better community to start my first ever football season with. I felt safe and nurtured, every time I went to the club I walked away with a smile on my face. A highlight of my season was winning our first game, I felt on top of the world. All of the spectators ran up to me and that's when I knew my future was at the Cove Football Club. Every day at school in class I would think about going to see my best friends and teammates for football training. At training our cheeky smiles would take us for a lap of the oval while we talked about our day. The Cove Football Club is a place where I always want to be and I never want to leave, a place where everyone is friendly. It's a place where I belong. Every game, every training I walked away with a new friend, and a new reason to be happy. If this club goes away where do I go? There's not going to be another club that makes me feel the way I do after every training, game or presentation.

The Cove Football Club had a very successful season winning 2 premierships in the Open Women's and Under 12 grades during 2019, my mother and brother played in these teams.

At the Cove Football Club win or lose the community supports each other. Allegations of 'sexual harassment' have been put against my clubs name. This is the complete opposite to my experience at the club where I always feel supported and safe.

The fact that the council has made this decision, doing little to help the football club this season after taking control of the Cove complex, is outrageous. I am very frustrated that from one or two alleged wrong actions, the whole club from juniors to seniors has been affected. This leaves me questioning 'will my dream of playing for Cove Football Club live on?' Why impose cruel long term consequences that have adverse impacts on young innocent teens and my community? Little do the council know that this is more than a club, this is a community home for us juniors, where **we feel safe**. If the council do not allow the football club back it will initiate fragmentation in our community. Not only fragmentation but hundreds of kids like me may **not ever** return to football. This leaves me with limited opportunities in sport for the future. The question spirals through my head 'will I ever see my teammates who I call my best friends again?'

I have a community to go to, a place where I can run with pride with my Cove Cobras uniform on; I have a community where I feel safe; I have a community who supports me and who cheers for me from the sidelines; I have a community who cares for me and who looks after me, but I can't feel supported or safe if there is nowhere for me to go. Is the council going to help build up my community or take it from me?

Ps The club is my life please don't take it off of me.




