#### 1. Introduction

City of Marion is planning a new playground and reserve upgrade at Ballara Park, Warradale.

This is a neighbourhood level reserve, with a local level play space. The site is designed to cater to people living and working within walking distance.

The existing play space will be removed, and the new playground will be built on one of the tennis courts. The other tennis court will be retained and upgraded for community use with a new surface and fencing. The existing 3 on 3 basketball court will be retained and the shelter relocated next to the tennis court.

Key elements of the design include:

- Accessible in ground trampoline
- Resurfaced tennis court with separate netball ring and new line marking
- Monkey bars
- Vertical climbing net
- 1.2m high slide
- Play panels
- Swings
- New drinking fountain
- Book swap cabinets
- Picnic setting
- Landscaping
- Potential Kaurna art elements

### 2. Executive Summary

Council received 40 responses to the online survey. Feedback included:

- 87.5% were either very happy or happy with the concept plan
- The top 3 items in the concept plan that respondents liked were: (1) the overall upgrades,
   (2) resurfaced / redeveloped tennis courts, and (3) that the reserve will cater for a range of ages, abilities and activities.
- 80% of respondents supported the removal of the car parking underneath the trees along Ormonde Avenue (as shown in the concept plan).

Note: The car parking scope of work is outside of the Open Space upgrade. The request for inclusion was from the City of Marion Engineering department and further discussions are required to detail the next steps and timing for any actions within their work area plan.

#### 3. Consultation Program

The community engagement was undertaken over four weeks from 22 November – 20 December 2021.

#### It included:

- An information postcard sent to households within a 400m² radius from the reserve
- Information on the Making Marion website
- An online survey
- Facebook posts

- Onsite signage
- Community drop in session on Thursday 2 December 4-6pm

#### 4. Consultation Overview


During the consultation period Council received:

- 53 visits to the online survey
- 40 survey responses
- 15 people attended the community drop in session

# 5. Consultation Findings

Each question is listed with the corresponding graph and results summary.

### Q1. How happy are you with the concept plan for Ballara Park Reserve?



# **Summary of results**

A total of 40 respondents completed this question:

87.5% (35 respondents) were either very happy or happy with the concept plan

12.5% (5 respondents) were neutral and 0% were not happy

#### Q2. What do you like about the concept plan?

#### **Summary of results**

We received 34 text responses to this question. Below is a summary of the key elements that respondents liked about the concept plan. The ticks / number represent the number of times mentioned. The top 3 items in the concept plan that respondents liked were the overall upgrades, resurfaced / redeveloped tennis courts, and that the reserve will cater for a range of ages, abilities and activities.



We received 40 responses to this question, with high support for the removal of car parking:


80% (32 respondents) stated that they support the removal of car parking 8% (3 respondents) do not support 12% (5 respondents) are unsure



# 6. Community Drop In Session

A community drop in session was held on Thursday 2 December 2021. Approximately 15 people attended this session. The purpose of the session was to find out more about the concept plan and discuss any ideas or concerns. The feedback was recorded and will be considered in the upcoming detailed design phase.

# 7. Design Response

Some key themes emerged throughout the consultation and evaluation process.

# Overall summary of key themes and the design response:

Key Theme	No. times issue raised	Design response
Fully fence the playground (from the tennis court)	3	We will investigate the option of extending the fence to avoid any conflicts between the tennis court and playground (subject to favourable tender pricing). We intend to keep it open however, to enable the tennis court to be easily used for bike and scooter activities.
Add additional trampolines	2	Budget for this project unfortunately does not allow for additional trampolines. The playspace is designated as a local level playspace.
Provision for younger children (eg steps)	2	Will be included in the detailed design for the platform

In addition to the original concept and subject to favourable market conditions, a mini soccer goal has been added to the grassed area.

Resurfaced tennis courts, in ground trampoline

Great area for young children, parking is safer for kindy children, trampoline and slide. It looks and will be loved by everyone.

Indigenous connection idea is wonderful. Please include this! I also love that a tennis court will be kept and upgraded for use. I like the selection of play equipment.

A flatter and safer track.

#### Appendix 2

#### All 30 text responses to Question 4: Any other comments or feedback?

A bbg area would be great near tennis courts for family days

No

Instead of removing car parks it would be better to move them back and put the footpath in front of them for safety of pedestrians

There could be more trampolines added, one small one doesn't seem enough. The play space seems to be aimed at very young children, with no challenging aspects for slightly older children.

Is it possible to look at creating car parking where the exisiting play space is? The street is very busy during kindergarten pick up / drop off and the removal of car parking on Ormonde Street will only increase that congestion.

We will need just 1 Disabled car parking space, to accommodate children with disabilities accessing the kindergarten and playground

There doesn't appear to be physical development opportunities for younger kids eg those learning to climb (1yr-3yrs). Many of the kids at the kindy have young siblings. This makes it hard to attend the playground. See tunnel and steps at Ballara park now

Love the variety but suggest relocating running track to area 3 to minimise congestion in the play area and utilise area 3 as it is clear of the trees.

With removal of car parking, need to add 25 mph zone to the side streets: Kelvin and Ballara. I am concerned about there being no continuous fence between the tennis court and the play area.

The tree on Ormonde Avenue and Ballara Ave loose a lot of bark and branches and which make the existing tennis courts untidy.

these trees be lopped to reduce the amount of green debris as the new courts will look just as untidy as they do now.

the reason I don't support the future removal of car parking underneath the trees is because of the safety issue of very young children being near the road, especially due to parents who place their youngest in the back seat on the drivers side of the car

More seating or grass where families can sit and picnic and enjoy the play space at the same time is needed. similar to Hendrie st reserve

Having 4 children ages 12-21, I think this is a great idea and will all get use out of the new upgrade. I do hope by removing some of the carparking spaces wont affect kindy drop off/pickup. And a toilet would be great.

Will there still be a grassed area that allows dogs (even if only on lead)?

More than 1 shelter and BBQs would be great for the community

1. No metal slide (unusable even in 18degrees when full sun). 2. 1

trampoline insufficient as large groups of children play at one after kindy. 3. Include a junior basketball ring on court. 4. Logs, rocks, water play etc in the large garden area for play.

Our family would love it if the basketball court is resurfaced and sprayed with basketball lines. Water pools on the court after rain restricting its use after rain so it could do with a resurface and the lines would add to the courts worth too.

I'd love to see more night lit tennis courts that are available for community use - at the moment I have to travel outside the council area to be able to play at twilight - I'd love to play on a Marion council court in the future at twilight

Any equiptment that is suitable for toddler play is a big bonus. This is the reason we currently walk to this park every day for my 2yo son. Other parks, the equipment can be too advanced

For safety reasons, it would be great to have the whole park area fenced off, not just the playground. Also, a fenced off section for dogs to run free would be amazing!

If parking is removed on Ormonde Avenue, please consider alternative parking.

I work at the kindy and as much as I agree about the parking under the tree being removed I strongly recommend that we have two parking bays clearly only for Disabled people . We have children in wheelchairs and elderly grandparents with walking issues

There is a long term issue of kindergarten staff cars parking in the street, in particular opposite private driveways, the frequency of motor vehicle accidents has increased due to the increase of new dwellings.

This will be an asset to the kindy and the other; however I am concerned about safety when Ormonde Avenue is used as a "fast" cut through. Can we have some speed humps /barriers around the reserve to keep children and pets safe please?

If a tennis court is being removed, is there not enough room for off street parking that the footpath can go around? Better facilities = more cars & if parked on the street, very frustrating for residents.

Please dont include the Kookaburra. I like your attempts to connect to bird life, but the Kookaburra is not here. There are scores of parrots in those trees overnight. Crimson Rosellas, Rainbow Lorikeets, etc. They are a lot more appropriate than the Kook

The Park behind the Oaklands swimming centre is excellent - could the Ballara Park be modelled on this design?

I do not want the kindy driveway to become a public car park that will be 90cm from my bedroom window. I seek that a vehicle gate be put on the driveway entrance and that wheelstops be installed where staff park (the fence is already damaged from cars).

Would love a higher slide. 1.2m is very low. Perhaps 2 slides? A higher one & the 1.2m? Research supports risky play in early childhood to develop risk management skills. 1.2m is disappointingly low considering the existing playground has 2 high slides

It is unacceptable that you would accept a move of an entire playground into the full sun without any shade. There absolutely needs to be a fence between the courts and the playground to protect all parties.

#### Appendix 3 – Email Feedback – Ballara Park Reserve Upgrade

#### Dear Danielle,

I have recently filled out the survey for the upgrade to the Ballara Park upgrade, however the restriction of 255 words didn't seem enough for me to comment on 2 important safety points, and I'd like to expand on them further.

I am the mother of a 2 year old. We only recently moved into the area, but have been using that playground quite frequently.

- 1) Whilst I can certainly understand that trees for shade create the exact risk that has caused the re-location, I am very concerned about the lack of shade over the equipment. The justification that it is not a "larger playground" is not sufficient as surely it should still be useable. The location of the proposed trees is clearly not going to provide any cover for the play equipment.
  - The lack of shade is incredible limiting to useability. It is my experience that the impact surfacing gets far hotter than organic materials and this combination will make the playground unusable for significant periods of time. This is a health concern for children and I think the lack of this protection goes directly against the "greener, cooler, and more climate resilient Adelaide" principle. All information tells us that temperatures are on the rise, and the lack of shade/sun protection means the playground cannot be safely/comfortably used for an increasing number of hours over the years.
- 2) I note that there is currently no fence between the playground and the courts and think this is imperative to add one. Children need to be able to play without the risk of a wayward ball travelling at speed unprotected into the playscape. Conversely, players need to be comfortable they can play without a child running onto the court. The placement of a running track right along "the border" is further risk as children could get onto the court in a split second even with an adult very close by. There must be a fence all the way around the court to protect children and adults alike.

My son is only 2, and although he won't be this young for long – the community needs to provide spaces where young children can safely play, not just older kids. This means enclosed, protected spaces.

We love this little playground exactly because it is little. We walk there several times a week. I recognise the need for the current playscape to be improved to address safety issues, but I hope some further amendments are being considered to ensure it remains a safe, protected and comfortable area.







#### Appendix 5 - Ballara Park Kindergarten Feedback

Council consulted directly with the Ballara Park Kindergarten to engage with the children on ideas for the playground and reserve as a pre-consultation.

A survey was conducted with the Ballara Park Kindergarten from 31 August - 14 September 2021.

We received feedback from the Ballara Park Kindergarten families and stakeholders on:

- What they like about Ballara Park
- What can be improved
- The experiences they are seeking within the park

### Summary of the 14 responses received

What they like about Ballara Park:

- Green open space, trees, birdlife
- Playground, shade, nature

What can be improved:

- Tennis/basketball court
- Play equipment
- Landscaping
- Amenities (drinking fountain, picnic table, toilet, and fence)
- Parking
- Shelter/seating

Play experiences they are seeking within the park:

- Swings
- Slide
- Trampoline
- Monkey Bars
- -Café (allow coffee van to locate onsite)

#### Appendix 6 - Children's Voices

Council engaged with the Ballara Park Kindergarten to capture the children's voices. During Term 4 the kindergarten teachers educated the class on the steps that are undertaken to design and build a play space. The children also got see this take place, as the kindergarten also had their own play area redeveloped in term 4.

The children developed playground models out of natural materials, and presented these to Council staff and their own families.

Council staff also presented the concept plan to the children, who voted as a group on their favourite play items in the design. The most popular items were:

- (1)Slide
- (2) Trampoline
- (3) Carousel
- (4) Swing
