## SITE BACKGROUND

Scarborough Terrace Reserve was once a vineyard, belonging to Patrilli Winery.

Giovanni Patrilli purchased nearly 60 acres of land, including Scarborough Terrace Reserve, and planted mostly muscat and doradillo vines for wine making.

In 1961, Patrilli sold off several allotments to the Minister of Education and a technical girls high school was built on the site. The reserve served as a oval for the school.

By 1993, the school was no longer operating and the land was purchased for housing. Marion Council acquired the reserve to ensure that open space was retained and could be used by the community.

The current playground was built in 2001, with the fitness track added in 2008.

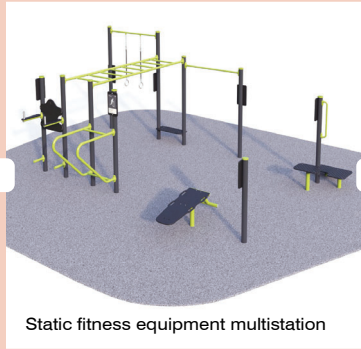
Scarborough Terrace Reserve now has mature trees to shade the site and is a well used open space servicing the community.

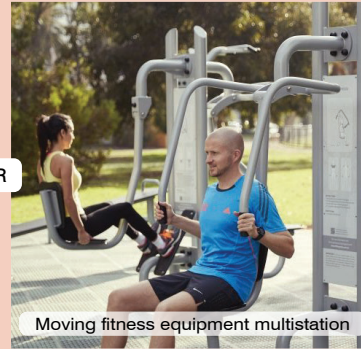
