1. Introduction

City of Marion is planning a new local level playground and reserve upgrade at Wistow Reserve, Trott Park.

A concept plan has been developed for the reserve and includes:

- A natural timber multi-station with various climbing elements and a slide
- Nature play including log steppers, balancing logs and stepping stones
- New trees, planting and landscaping
- A new pathway from Wistow Crescent into the reserve
- New irrigation
- Drinking fountain
- Informal seating

In May/ June 2021 Council completed community engagement to seek the community views of the proposed concept plan.

This report provides information on the consultation undertaken and the feedback received.

The findings will be used to finalise the concept plan, to proceed to the next stage of detailed design and construction.

2. Executive Summary

Council received 21 responses to the online survey. There was high support for the upgrade with 77% of respondents either very happy or happy with the concept plan for Wistow Crescent Reserve.

The elements that respondents liked most about the concept plan included:

- (1) nature play
- (2) overall upgrades
- (3) new trees / landscaping

The adventure play was also popular.

The aspects that respondents would like to see improved in the concept plan included:

- (1) swing(s)
- (2) more kick about space
- (3) suitable elements for toddlers and younger children.

There was a strong preference for the reserve to be family friendly and cater for a range of ages. Many liked the ideas in the concept plan and are excited about the upgrades.

3. Consultation Program

The community engagement was undertaken over four weeks from 4 May – 1 June 2021. It included:

- An information postcard sent to 950 households within a 500m² radius from the reserve
- Information on the Making Marion website
- An online survey
- Facebook posts
- Onsite signage

4. Consultation Overview


During the consultation period Council received:

- 29 visits to the online survey
- 21 survey responses
- 25 people attended the community drop in session on 18 May 2021

5. Consultation Findings

Each question is listed with the corresponding graph and results summary.

Q1. How happy are you with the concept plan for Wistow Crescent Reserve?



Summary of results

A total of 21 respondents completed this question:

- 77% of respondents stated they were very happy/ happy with the concept plan
- 14% were neutral and 9% not happy

Q2. What do you like about the concept plan?

Summary of results

We received 21 text responses to this question. Below is a summary of the key elements that respondents liked about the concept plan. The ticks / number represent the number of times mentioned. The top 3 items included 1. nature play, 2. overall upgrades and 3. new trees / landscaping.

Q3. What could be improved in the concept plan?

Summary of results

We received 19 text responses, and 2 respondents skipped this question.

Below is a summary of the main improvements that respondents would like to see in the design. The ticks/numbers represent the number of times mentioned.

The top 3 improvements suggested included 1. swings, 2. more kick about space and 3. suitable elements for toddlers and younger children.





Summary of results

The majority of respondents are aged 25-35 years (57%) and 56-70 years (24%).



Summary of results

The majority of respondents are from Trott Park (90%).

6. Community Drop In Session

A drop in session was held on 18 May 2021 from 4.30pm-5.30pm and approximately 25 people attended the session. Attendees were interested in viewing the concept plans and offered feedback including:

- Add a swing
- Include a few activities / equipment for younger children eg see-saw
- Add seats for parents and grandparents
- Keep the open lawn kick-about spaces
- Consider irrigated turf

There was a strong preference for the reserve to be family friendly and cater for a range of ages. Some were seeking the nature play to be reduced in favour of additional structured playground equipment (eg-swings). Many liked the ideas in the concept plan and are excited about the upgrades.

7. Design Response

Some key themes emerged throughout the consultation and evaluation process which have influenced the final design.

Overall summary of key themes and the design response:

Key Theme	No. times issue raised	Design Response
Playground equipment:	10 1 1 1 1 1 1 1 1 1	This reserve is a local level playground designed to cater for people within walking distance. It will be less developed than a neighbourhood or regional reserve and will include a slide and combination system, in accordance with the City of Marion playground framework. It has been noted that the community would like a swing, and this will be added in the next revision of the design. However, due to budget constraints the combination unit and nature play may need to be reduced in size (to enable a swing to be added). A drinking fountain, bin and seat will be added to the design.
More kick- about irrigated open space	3	Some irrigated open space will be included in the design. This area will allow for some ball games. However, for larger kick about open space please visit Barton Drive Reserve, Sandy Glass Court Reserve, Montague Drive Reserve or Hallett Close Reserve in Sheidow Park.
Add equipment for younger children	3	The concept plan caters for a range of ages, including younger children. A swing set will be added to ensure very young children are catered for at this site.

Additional trees / plantings	2	Additional tree / plants will be incorporated, subject to budget.
Aboriginal concepts	1	We will consider Aboriginal concepts as the design evolves in the next phase of the planning.
Less nature play	1	Nature play is a popular activity and is designed to promote imaginative / creative play and encourage children to engage with the natural environment. All City of Marion playground upgrades include nature play components.
Height of playground / overlooking	1	Have noted concerns regarding overlooking adjoining properties. It will be ensured that the playground platform height is not too high (to reduce any potential of viewing over surrounding fences).

We thank all that provided their feedback and participated in the engagement process.

The feedback will help finalise the Wistow Crescent Reserve concept plan to proceed to detailed design.

Maybe add some Aboriginal concepts would be a nice feature too.

Would like to see more large trees near the fences

Don't have too much garden bed - it's a great area for the kids to kick around a ball too so some open grass area is appreciated.

It is not user friendly for toddlers and younger, we have been using the current park since my 2yr old was 9months. This new design and all new parks are not suitable for this age. They need easy steps. It is also removing to much of the open grass.

Add a drinking fountain and a bin

A swing set and a place to sit and watch/ have a snack

The demographic here is young so a swing and slide are important. Seating for parents and grandparents.

Fewer shrubs and more lawn for active play/sport (positioning the playground towards an end of the park, instead of centrally would help). Fewer stepping logs in favour of things kids play on for extended periods would be great (swings/spinners/sand pit)

Any additional plants where possible

Would love to see a swing

I would like to see the design allow all ages to use the slide toddlers and older kids and maybe for it to be a double slide. The design of the playground seem to be design around older children 3+ not allowing younger children to climb up to the slide.

Installation of a swing and ride on equipment

Kids play soccer and football etc on the grass area as yards in our suburb are not huge. Please consider how very young children could use this park. No new parks are safe for 2 and under. We use this park often as it is easy for my son to use others are not

With the increased height of the playground you will need to look at increasing the height of the fences to Bendigo close as you will be able to see into the bathroom of one of the houses

More lawn area for ball games

This is a very close, quiet park so the equipment needs to be for 1 - 10 year old not teens

Thank you for upgrading the park, it really needs it! Have you considered older kids and adults regarding equipment? (Eg a basketball court/fitness equipment).

Would be so pleased to see the proposed improvements. Children who visit me will be able to play there as I sit on one of the playground seats

Love to see the rock like sandpits with tree stamp seating and table to allow parents to sit with the children.

Many of us have lived in the area for many years and now have grandchildren so would appreciate some appropriate equipment be Installed for under 5 year olds as well as what is proposed

The playground seen mainly focused on younger children. If there were monkey bars it would cater to older children too.

Make it little kid friendly (toddlers)
