

Yanyarrie Avenue Reserve Playground

Final Concept Community Consultation Findings

June 2020

1. Introduction

This report summarises community consultation undertaken on the draft concept plan for the development of Yanyarrie Avenue Reserve, Edwardstown.

The playground at the reserve was installed in 1994 and consists of the following facilities: A multistation playground, slide, a 3 on 3 basketball court, picnic tables and seating. Yanyarrie Avenue Reserve playground has reached its useful life expectancy and needs an upgrade.

2. Consultation Program

The purpose of the engagement was to inform the community members of the draft concept for Yanyarrie Avenue Reserve and seek their feedback. The consultation survey was open for 4 weeks from 29 April 2020 to 27 May 2020. Initially, consultation was intended for 3 weeks but was extended by one week to allow for further promotion and community uptake.

The survey was made available online at makingmarion.com.au/yanyarrie-avenue-reserve

The community were informed about the survey in the following ways:

- **Flyer** A hard copy postcard was delivered to approximately 800 households within roughly 400m² radius of the reserve outlining the period of consultation.
- **Onsite sign** An onsite sign was installed at the reserve promoting the Making Marion link and consultation deadline.
- Social Media Social media posts were placed on the City of Marion Facebook page.
- An onsite consultation was not held due to mandatory Federal government health restrictions for the coronavirus (Covid-19). Increased social media measures were used, including paid promotion, to ensure awareness whilst following strict public gathering measures.

3. Consultation Overview

Community members were invited to provide feedback on the draft concept plan for Yanyarrie Reserve through the online survey and quick poll tools via Making Marion.

In summary, during this 4-week consultation period Council received:

- 34 electronic votes via the Making Marion quick poll
- 36 electronic responses from the Making Marion survey
- 1 email via the Customer Event System. This has been responded to and resolved.
- 1 phone call via the Customer Event System. This has been responded to and resolved.

A full summary of all responses to each survey question, poll results and customer event feedback are provided within this report. Responses have been listed as worded by the respondent. For privacy reasons, respondents' details have not been included.

4. Consultation Findings

Overall, the draft concept plan for Yanyarrie Avenue Reserve has been well received and responses were very constructive. In summary:

- A total of 441 visits were recorded to the project's Making Marion web page where residents could access the Draft Concept Plan and postcard. Engagement tools included the quick poll system and the survey tool.
- 34 responses to the quick poll were received.
- 36 responses to the survey were received.

5. Summary of feedback received

The table below identifies the items raised regarding the playground upgrade and how the feedback was considered when finalising the concept design.




Quick Poll Results



Summary of results: An overwhelming majority of residents are in support of the concept plan. There are positive comments and excitement about the design becoming a reality. Those unsure or unsatisfied with the plan mostly represent respondents with children in younger age groups. This has been mitigated with younger playground options being catered to in the revised final design.


SURVEY RESULTS

Q1 What do you intend to use the upgraded reserve for?



Summary of results: The above bar graph shows most respondents (35 people) plan to use the playground. Two thirds of the respondents (21 people) intend to use the site for netball/basketball/kick about games and picnics. Similarly two thirds of the respondents (20 people) look forward to relaxation and being amongst nature. Dog walking received the lowest number of votes (13 people) followed by general exercise and recreation (15 people).


Overall people will gain the most value from this site through the playground use. There are a significant number of residents who would appreciate ball game facilities or kick about areas. Picnic facilities will allow residents to extend their stay at the reserve.



Summary of results: The graph shows children aged 0 to 3 years old (20 children) represent the biggest age group. Children aged 5 to 12 years old are the second largest age group (16 children). Around half of the respondents have children aged 3 to 5 years old (12 children). Only a small percentage of children are aged 12 years and over (4 children).

Overall, toddlers are the largest demographic for this site followed by primary school aged children. High school children represent the lowest demographic within this survey. It is recommended that younger play elements are incorporated with a view to multigenerational play options for the remaining equipment. This will enable play for children now and into the future.

Q3. What type of swing do you prefer?




Summary of results:

Most residents want a 360 degree basket swing (55%) and a third prefer a traditional swing (33.3%). Just over 10 per cent want a standard basket swing. While other options are listed they represent multiple swing options and additional facilities that are not within the current service levels or budget constraints.

For the other swing option, the comments were:


- Spider swing
- Two side by side baby swings. I have only found one park that has it in (princess Margaret playground - Black Forest) often mums go to playground together so if they could push kids at the Same time with side by side baby swings. Also I have a 3 and 1 year old and they both constantly fight over the one baby swing.
- Love the large swing however smaller children might be scared of going on it. A couple of small swings should be included.
- Should have both standard basket and traditional swing too i.e. combination of swings for various ages. Something similar to Jervois street reserve can be considered.
- Need to make it safe and big for the community. Adding water inlets and bbq points would be helpful
- While the 360 degree basket swing looks like fun. The space it takes up is too great. The park is small and the space can be used for other creative play.

Q4. Which type of climbing feature do you like most?



Summary of results: Boulder climbing (72.2%) was the most popular climbing feature for this reserve. The remaining quarter of respondents preferred steel bar (16.7%) and rope climbing (11.1%).

Q5. Overall, how satisfied are you with the proposed design?



Mandatory Question (36 response(s)) Question type: Radio Button Question

Summary of results: An overwhelming majority of residents (86.1%) are supportive of this design. This is represented as the combined percentage totals of residents very satisfied (27.8%) and satisfied (58.3%) with the design.

A minority of respondents are dissatisfied (11.1%) and very dissatisfied (2.8%) with the results. Those unsatisfied with the results represent residents who want younger playground options. This is being incorporated into the final design.

The other had requested another option for a swing as the 360 degree one used a lot of space. This conflicts with most residents who prefer this element. The recommendation is to retain the 360-degree swing in line with many residents' preferences.

Q6. Please tell us why?


- Looks very exciting but would love a bike track of some sort!

- Looks great massive improvement on what is existing.


- It looks great and i think the design has been well thought out.

- It looks great and i think the design has been well thought out. We do use the courts currently
 for tennis and hockey matches please view the google search images for the reserve and you
 can see one of our hockey games played there. so (sic) the circle design would mean we could no
 longer play there.
- I think the playground needs a flying fox, a sandpit and triangle monkey bars, high slid and roundabout
- The reserve needs an upgrade, the design looks good. I would like a slide included if possible.
- design (sic) covers a broad range of requirements. and maintains current attractions.
- I feel like there should be more actual play equipment for children, all that is being proposed is a swing and the boulder climber... it's inappropriate for younger children, and most children want a playground to have an actual playground.
- I love the trike track. Plenty of grass area. Love the water fountain and seats.
- Baby swings. Add 2. They are never available and kids always fight over them.
- Looks very exciting but would love a bike track of some sort!
- Great space for older kids and teens. Parhaps (sic) more could be done for younger children.
- The proposed design has minimal or no items for young children i.e. up to 3 years old. Some slides for young children, with some swings, seasaw (sic) and play places should be added to the plan. We propose Six avenue reserve and Jervois street reserve (specially) (sic) as design guides for considering additional items.
- Looks as though nature will be increased and seating. Equipment is broad for children of different ages.
- Looks great massive improvement on what is existing.
- I think its (sic) more aimed at older children and would like to see more toddler friendly play equipment.
- The overall layout and design appears to be very limited for a younger age group and more focused to a (sic) older age group which unfortunately doesn't match the local area. There have been quite a few new homes built in the area and there are going to be a few more and as is there are quite a lot of children in the 3 10 age group. Equipment that can accommodate more

Comments summary: Residents are pleased with the proposed designs. Requests for other play elements and amenities exceed what is deliverable on a neighbourhood level budget. Consideration has been made for younger play elements and provisions will be included in the final design.





Summary of results: Most residents prefer to keep the fence (77.8%) with (8.3%) seeking to remove the fence and (13.9%) unsure. Based on this feedback the fence will be retained onsite.

Q7. Do you have any other comments about the upgrade at Yanyarrie Avenue Reserve?

- Please can we have a bmx bike track of some sort in marion (sic) area. We don't have anything like that around and have to travel to take the kids. Thank you.
- Finally! So many kids in the area but no good playgrounds.
- Other items that the council may consider are, more benches, beautiful shelters and provision of a BBQ as well. To reduce vandalism, can the council consider CCTV camera in the reserve?
- Please make sure it is fenced for safety.
- I have an 8 year old who is desperate for a playground to have monkey bars. My kids are 8 and 10 and are both getting bored with existing playgrounds that have been established. The boulder climb is an excellent feature for their age groups. If there was an additional swings to the basket swing that would be great.
- Possible slide and water/sand play would be nice
- I would like to see the reserve have lighting and protected by some sort of solar powered cctv or alikes if
 possible so that our children and grandchildren can enjoy the reserve for longer than 5 minutes if the local
 ungrateful demographic get to it.
- Please make it big and yet safe with proper light provisions as well
- Toilets would bea great!
- Bbg area and picnic tables
- My parting words are that Yankarrie (sic) needs to be a park that brings young families together to strengthen
 community bonds. This is especially important when houses are being crammed together that have very little,
 if any, open spaces in back yards to play in. It's a "walk to" space but that doesn't mean it has to be a "walk
 to" space that no-one wants to use or cares about.
- Loving the design, I just feel that the young children in the 0-3 age bracket have been missed. A BBQ and toilet facilities would be an added bonus. Food for thought.
- Inclusive Play guidelines!!!
- Be aware that cars often speed down Yanyarrie Avenue
- No
- Please fence the playgrounds!!! It's so stressful when they aren't fenced eg: Allison st playground we can no longer use. Also a toilet if possible with young children is so important
- Would you please add special/ seperate safe area for baby & infants (example 0- 4yr group)? There is no safe public playground for very young kids esp at Marion area. Baby and infants need their outdoor play area as well to develop their sensory and muscles. But in the public playground, lots of bigger kids running around that can be bumped with each other, or designed with rocks or sharp edges that can be unsafe for babies/infants to explore nature & doing outdoor activity. So I would suggest to create an area for them, safe, seperate (sic) with bigger kids area, secure them with fence.
- Additional seating near swing, so carers can sit while children are on equipment.
- Overall looks like a great positive space. It would be better with a toilet. The giant basket swing takes up a
 large amount of space whilst only being able to entertain a small number at a time. Something included for
 younger children would be great.

Comments summary: Residents have provided positive feedback on this reserve concept design. The BMX track, slide and sand pit are unable to be achieved on a neighborhood service level playground budget.

Nearby toilet and barbeque locations are listed in the summary of feedback table.

Benches and shelter have been considered and catered to within this concept plan.

Fencing and younger play provisions will be included in the final concept design.


1. Social Media Post



I am a resident of Marion council who lives on Yanyarrie Ave in Edwardstown.

I am aware of the plans from the council to revamp the Yanyarrie Reserve and am very pleased to hear it is going ahead. It is much needed and my kids will certainly make use of the new and modern play equipment.

Upon looking at the plans my only concern in the size of the basketball space.

Ive (sic) lived at 1 Yanyarrie Ave for almost 15 years now and the park is sparsely used in its current form except for a few groups that come to play basketball, and by me. I have rarely seen large groups gather for picnics or meetings except for myself. I have been hosting street hockey games there for the past 10 years, sometimes with groups of 15-30 people for a BBQ and some friendly games. By the current plan, it appears that space would be too small for us to use anymore, which (sic) would be a shame considering as I said, in my time, we are the only group ive (sic) ever seen use it. Id like you to consider expanding the court size and making it suitable for us to continue to use.


